

# **Closing the 2005 Funding Gap**

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#### Introduction

This note provides an update on the magnitude of the funding gap for 2005 as background to considering how the shortfall could be eliminated prior to the approval of Round 5 proposals in September 2005.

#### 2005 Funding Gap: US\$ 0.7 billion

With an estimated need of US\$2.3 billion for grant approvals in 2005 and funding of US\$1.6 expected to be available based on pledges to date, a gap of US\$ 0.7 billion remains to be filled by September 2005.

### Annex 2: Pledges for 2005 Compared with Historic Share

This table expresses each pledge for 2005 as a percentage of the total contributions needed for 2005 (column B). Each donor's historic share of total contributions is also computed, as an average of contributions through 2004 (column A).

A comparison of the 2005 pledge percentage with the historic contribution share (B - A), indicates the change in the donor's contribution share, based on pledges to date.

A negative percentage (for B-A) indicates that the donor's current pledge for 2005 represents a lesser share than historically, while a positive percentage indicates a greater share than historically.

<sup>(1)</sup> It is assumed that Round 5 grants will be approved in 2005, Round 6 in 2006 and Rounds 7 & 8 in 2007. The total value of grants approved for Phase I of each round (the initial two years) is assumed to be \$1 billion for Round 5, \$1.1 billion for Round 6 and \$1.3 billion for each of Rounds 7 & 8.

<sup>(2)</sup> It is assumed that Phase II budgets are, on average, 150% of Phase I budgets and that 85% (by monetary value) of grants are renewed for Phase II. The Phase II amounts are projections of renewals falling due in the year assuming that Phase II renewals are, on average, approved 20 months after the first disbursement.

<sup>(3)</sup> Operating Expenses, less Investment Income: Projected at less than \$20m. Operating Expenses comprise Local Fund Agent fees and Board, Technical Review Panel and Secretariat expenses.

<sup>(4)</sup> The 2005 pledge amount includes \$0.1 billion of 2004 pledges expected to be contributed in 2005
