	We have witnessed major advancements in prevention, treatment, care and support for HIV, tuberculosis and malaria since the creation of the Global Fund in 2002. Twenty million lives have been saved through Global Fund programming alone. While celebrating these tremendous gains, we must not lose sight of the challenges on the near horizon. In particular, how can we ensure these gains are sustained as country-led responses transition to domestic financing, as demands on finite resources become even tighter, and as human rights and key and vulnerable populations continue on the margins of the global response? Over a 1.5-day workshop, civil society participants will drill into these complex policy issues that promise to impact Global Fund programming and procedures for years to come. Discussions will define the challenges ahead and map a coordinated course of action to ensure we address these challenges.
