*As the amount of revised existing funding for grant UKR-C-UCDC exceeds the revised budget (i.e. the funding needs) for the respective grant, the excess of US\$906,877 will be reallocated into grant UKR-C-AUN. Similarly, US\$2,530,380 of excess funding in grant UKR-C-AUA will be reallocated into grant UKR-C-AUN to finance the increased revised budget.

¹ This table summarizes reinvestment of additional savings into the Ukraine TB/HIV program. As the identified savings relate to the in-country cash balance (existing funding), the additional funding will not impact the incremental funding approved by the Board in December 2014 (GF/ B32/EDP01) but will increase existing funding and budget of constituent grants.
