

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



Progress in addressing AMAs

- As of 31 January 2025, there are 80 open AMAs, with 46 closed since end of January 2024. This includes six AMAs merged into two actions and one written off. 36 new AMAs arose from OIG audits and investigations between the end of January 2024 2025
 - The Secretariat has reduced the number of long overdue AMAs by 47% compared to last year. The Grant Management Division recently closed six long overdue AMAs related to Madagascar, Sierra Leone, Namibia, and Kenya. A cross-departmental AMA on mitigating and responding to sexual exploitation and abuse risks was also closed. Enhancements to the Wambo.org control framework have been implemented.
 - The number of open AMAs has remained generally stable over the past 13 months, as shown below:

Progress in addressing AMAs (continued)

- Despite the progress made, challenges remain in closing AMAs on time. The percentage of AMAs that are implemented on time over a rolling three-year cycle was 21% as of January 2025, against the KPI of 60%. In particular, AMAs that span many departments average a 7 months delay, in addition to the agreed timeline: this is because these actions, which include enhancements to policy on Challenging Operating Environment (COE) portfolios and improvement over the Procurement Service Agents (PSAs), typically involve more coordination with many Secretariat teams
 - Progress in implementing overdue AMAs is also influenced by the situation in-country that is often beyond the Secretariat's control. As an example, four overdue AMAs from the audit of Global Fund grants to the Republic of Sudan cannot be implemented due to the ongoing conflicts at the country. The Secretariat is reassessing the viability of implementing the AMAs. Notwithstanding this, more than half of these long overdue AMAs have completion progress greater than 50%.
 - Given the current context and uncertainty across the global health sector, the OIG will work with the Secretariat to review the most critical actions that should be prioritized to support the Secretariat's risk trade-off decisions.




Prioritized AMA
